



## Region to Block

'Region to block' lets you **create extra regions** within a DS layout. Those regions are **exported as blocks** that you can **place anywhere** in your theme region. Fields attached to those regions, will be rendered into the block and outside the region where their original item resides. Important, the original item must be rendered as well on the page.

## Various Extras

The Extras module comes with a couple of smaller features: **contextual links**, **revision view modes**, **page title options** and **extra fields**. Some options are eligible to move to the core DS module in time.

## Panel View Modes

By default, Field UI is the tool to extend all your layouts for any entity. But there's even more! If you're a fan of Panels, you can **use the Panels layout editor** as well to style any view mode. This is great for consistency if you're already using Panels' Page manager.

Display Suite can **take over any Views template** (page, block) to display the available Views fields the way you want. The variables that are used in the default views.tpl.php are made available into the Field UI.

Display Suite uses CTools to manage all the settings. This allows you to use either its' **bulk exporter** or **Features** to export all settings to a separate module. Now you can easily **migrate your configuration** between environments keeping everything up-to-date.

Installing the module is as **easy as any other contrib module**. Display Suite depends on **CTools** and enabling the main module will extend your layout capabilities. There's also the **Extras module** with a lot of subtle features such as an override for the default search result display provided by Drupal core or Apache Solr.

## Installation



Display Suite allows you to take **full control** over the way your content will be **displayed** using a **drag and drop interface**. Arrange your nodes, views, comments, user data etc. the way you want without having to work your way through dozens of template files. A predefined list of layouts is available for even more drag and drop fun!
